Memorial from Overleers of the Poor A Memorial from the Overseers of the Poor of the Township of *Halifax*, was read, setting forth, that by the great Increase of the Poor in the Province, the Sumgranted by the Town of *Halifax*, last *January*, for the Support of the Poor the current Year, is greatly insufficient to answer that Purpose, and praying Relief.

Upon confideration of which Memorial,

Vote thereon.

Voted, That there be paid by the Treasurer, out of the publick Monies in the Treasury, to the Overseers of the Poor, the Sum of Sixty Pounds, towards discharging the Expence for maintaining the Poor in the Poorhouse.

Ordered, That this Vote be fent to the Council for their concurrence.

Bill for continuing Impost on Loaf Sugar, returned, not agreed to.

The Council fent down the Bill for continuing and explaining the Act for laying a Duty of Impost on Loaf Sugar, not agreed to.
