Ordered that the further hearing of that part of the said petition which complains of the want of a qualification of Mr. Yeamans, be postponed until tomorrow.

Ordered, that the Petition be received and referred to the Committee of supply.

The House, pursuant to the order of the day for the further hearing of that part of the Petition of William Peters, complaining of an undue election for Queen's County, which relates to the want of a qualification of Mr. Yeamans, one of the sitting members for the same County, went into consideration thereof.

Resolved that it is the opinion of this House that Richard Yeamans, Esquire, one of the sitting members for Queen's County, does not possess the qualification required by the third Section of the Act of the General Assembly of this Province, intituled, "An Act for regulating Elections of Representatives in General Assembly, and for limiting the duration of Assemblies in this Province:" And that the election of the said Richard Yeamans, be, and the same is hereby determined to be void.

On motion, the House went into Committee upon "A Bill to increase the number of Members to represent the County of Northumberland in General Assembly."
