DOCTOR'S WIFE MAY GO FREE

Alleged Eye-Witness Was Far From Place at Time of Shooting.

(By Special Wire to the Courier) MINEOLA, L. I., July 9. - It is not at all certain that there will be enough evidence for a grand jury indictment against Mrs. Florence Carman, charged with the murder of Mrs. Louise Bailey and yesterday committed to the county jail awaiting an examination on the charge. This was the opinion Assistant District Attorney Weeks expressed to-day.

Mrs. Carman's case was expected to come up before the grand jury to-day, but according to Mr. Weeks, there was little likelihood of an indictment. The number of witnesses to be examined would preclude this possibility to-day.

"It is not unlikely," said the Assistant District Attorney, "that when Mrs. Carman appears on Monday before Coroner Norton, who will then be acting in the capacity of justice of peace, she will be discharged."

At that time, Mrs. Carman's attorney will have a right to cross-examine the witnesses who testify against the prisoner.

Dr. Carman, who came to Mineola for the day, found his wife in better spirits when he visited her in jail. She seemed to have recovered her composure and to be less nervous.

After her husband left, Mrs. Carman broke down in her cell, and her condition became so acute, that the prison authorities were alarmed and called in the staff physician. She was taken to the Warden's office where she laid down on a couch and became quieter after sedatives had been given her. She refused, however, to go to bed.

George Levy, attorney for Mrs. Carman said to-day that he had discovered two new witnesses whose testimony he considered extremely valuable. He also said he had information that two of the witnesses whose testimony had been instrumental in causing the arrest of Mrs. Carman had been far from the Carman home at the time of the murder.

He has known several days that they suspected Mrs. Carman and added that if it had not been for the unfortunate diaphragm incident her name would never have come into the case as a suspect.

"She is innocent, as I know well, and I am sure that in the end this will be established without a doubt," he declared.

LIGHTNING STRIKES CAR; MOTORMAN GETS SHOCK
