

Third: Retreat in Italy must be the signal for disruption of Austria-Hungary.

Already the Austrian drive in Italy has been without question one of the war's most colossal failures. It holds some serious consequences for Austria as did the battle of the Marne for Germany. Not only that, but it puts Germany in a most serious position.

The possibility of defeat never enters into the German military plans. If Germany sends an army to stave off Austrian disaster, it will mean that the great summer offensive in Champagne and Picardy will have to be abandoned.

And with the American army at the front growing bigger every day. Gen. Foch might decide to put into operation this summer or autumn the great Allied drive which is planned for next year.

The critical question is complicated by the urgent necessity for keeping Austria in the war. Austria lost means Mittel Europa lost; the Kaiser's dream of world empire evaporated.

And the food riots in Austria must be stopped; the hungry Austrians must be fed or they will quit the war regardless of the plans of
