FIDDLED FOR A FARM.

How a Young Danish Sailor Became

what strange bits of history are con-nected with the homes in which they dwell, and the fertile fields that were world have, figuratively speaking, been bought for a song, but surely truth outstrips fiction in a case where 200 acres of fertile land in Upper Canada were the reward tendered, accepted, and given for a few tunes on the

history of Upper Canada is narrated by Mr. F. Elliott, who obtained his facts from Rev. Peter Cober, at pres-ent residing in New Gormley, and who is a descendant of the hero of the tale. Sometime about the year 1780 a young man named Holms left Copenthat day, plying between Liverpo and New York.

The life of a sailor in those days was a hard rough experience. Indeed, coarse food, rough, uncomfortable weary voyages made it anything but "A Grand Sweet Song," and our herowas getting heartily sick of the whole business, and resolved to make his escape at the earliest opportunity.

One night, when it was Holms' turn on the night watch, he resolved to put into execution a preconceived put into execution a precot Climbing to the top mast he fastened a long rope reaching from there to the upper deck. Grasping it firmly with both hands he swung himself like a pendulum back and forth with ever-increasing momentum to and from the direction of the dock. At last the supreme moment arrived, and as the rope swung its extreme length landward, he let go and fell in shore

for liberty.

Leaving the town behind he got into the sparsely settled country, where in the shelter of the forests he spent his days, and traveled by night. On what Holms subsisted on these marches to the interior of New York State is not on record. Feeling more sets now from his marchers he applied safe now from his pursuers he applied for shelter at farm houses, and after for shelter at farm houses, and after the manner of pioneer days, was hospitably received.

One evening a social party gathered at the hotel where he lodged to have a country dance. Unfortunately while they had a fiddle, there was no fiddler. In some way they elicited the information from the young Dane that he was a violinist, but he utterly refused to play. Finally a man in the growd said, "If you play for us tonight I will give you a deed for 200 acres of land in Upper Canada." Of course that decided it, and the music was well supplied. After the deed was transferred, Holms in course of time resolved to tramp to Canada and view his possessions. He found it to be Lot 30, Con. 3, Markham, near
