## Continuous Wheat Growing

Growing Wheat in Britain on Same Land for 78 Years.

It has long been a tradition of farming that two white-straw crops should not be grown in succession, and the tradition still lives although it is generally known that there are numerous cases in which the practice has been a success. The classical proof that white-straw crops can follow one another without deterioration of the land is afforted by experiments at Rothamsted Experimental Station, where wheat has been grown continuously on the same land for 73 years, with only two seasons' break for fallow, and barley has been grown for 63 years with only one season's fallow. In similar experiments at Woburn, on a much lighter soil, forty-four crops of wheat have been taken off the same land without any break, and forty-four crops of barley off the barley plots. As a commerdial proposition, wheat was grown almost continuously for 50 years on Mr Prout's land at Sawbridgeworth. Other instances are also known, particularly on chalky boulder clay where wheat has been grown for succession of years on the same land, and it may be taken as proved that the practice is quite feasible,




