EXCHANGE RATE

Must Pay Bills To American Houses

Regina, December 29.-A nine per cent. premium on American money is the quotation to reach Regina bankers by wire Saturday, an increase of one point over Friday's quotations. Commenting on the situation, the manager of a local bank said:

"The present high rate of exchange on American money is working to the advantage of Canada and Canadians generally. The exception is the man who owes large amounts in the United States, and he is holding off as long as he is able, thus retaining large sums in Canada that otherwise would be sent across the border. Farmers to Benefit

'Paper and pulp manufacturers, a very large proportion of whose product finds a market in the States, are making a killing. In the face of the present situation and the recent jumps in paper stocks on the exchanges, I cannot account for the increase in price of newsprint. Western mines are shipping coal to West states and are reaping a harvest on to benefit. Those who live near the boundary and have been getting wagon permits have been thus fortunate for some time. The American price is far above the Canadian, but on the basis of the fixed Canadian price of \$2.15 a bushel the farmer will get an additional sixteen cents of


