## GERMANS DEPORT BELGIANS

London, Sept. 4.—(Reuters) The Echo de Belgie states that the Germans at Hertubise have deported fifty workmen who refused to sign a contract to work in the army zone. The men were handcuffed and marched away. Women and children who tried to say good-bye to them were driven off with blows. Several women were hurt and a child nine years old had its shoulder broken by a blow from a rifle butt.

## ENTENTE EXCHANGE

Amsterdam, Sept. 4.—The favorable Entente war news from the Western front today caused a general advance in prices on the stock exchange here, with lively dealings in American securities. All Entente exchange rates were appreciably higher. The dollar has risen in three days from 1.92 to 2.03. The exchange rates of the Central Powers have dropped.
