REMARKABLE COUNTERFEIT.

A remarkably good counterfeit of the coin is in circulation in St. John and throughout Canada. The impression on the coin is exact in every particular. The ring of truth is wanting. The filling of the coin has a feeling like that of the ring of truth, etc., are all perfect. The makeup of the counterfeit is a new one. The body of the coin is composed of lead, hardened with glass, which reduces the weight of the lead and gives the spurious coin a feeling like that of the ring of truth. The counterfeit is covered with a thin veneer of white metal resembling silver which sometimes cracks in circulation and peels off with a knife or the finger nail. This surface coating carries the impressions. The filling of the coin has smooth surfaces. The counterfeit is too hard to bend. It is considered the cleverest imitation yet placed in circulation. The only thing it lacks is the ring of the true coin when it falls.—Record.

AFAIRS IN CUBA.

RIVERA'S CONDUCTING GOMEZ WANTS NO PEACE WITH SPAIN.

NEW YORK, April 7.—A Sun special from Havana says: "It is difficult to get from Spanish sources any news from Cuba. Cristobal concerning Gen. Rivera. The price of the permits only a few important details to be known. It is said here that Gen. Rivera is well in his health, and that he is suffering from fever, probably the result of unskilled treatment by his physicians. The room in which he is confined has no sanitary conveniences. Nothing that he could be called antiseptic treatment is applied to him or his chief staff, Col. Becallo. As his condition is so serious many Cubans believe that poison is applied to his wounds, but it is more likely that he is a victim of the prevailing ignorance among Spanish military doctors. The Spaniards say he is well treated and they doubtless believe this to be true. But the scanty medical resources at San Cristobal are certainly impeding his life. It is learned from reliable sources that when Rita Rivera was captured he was marching eastward to confer with General Gomez, in compliance with orders from his chief. General Gomez approved of Rivera's refusal to listen to the terms of the peace brought to him by the Spanish commissioners. Gomez says in a letter addressed to a friend in Sancti Spiritus: 'I have little doubt that the real purpose of General Weyler in making all these overtures for peace is to prepare a trap for and assassinate me. It is now pretty well settled that the tariff bill will not be introduced until after the Provincial election in Nova Scotia has taken place. There is still a good deal of speculation as to what the tariff amendments will be like, but the conviction grows stronger every day that while there will be a considerable lowering of the tariff it will be far from being done with a view to encouraging trade with the Mother Country as opposed to the United States. Thus the Liberal Party in Ontario will be able to give an exhibition of how little the Liberal Party in Opposition knows about the needs of the best interests of the Country. For long years Sir Richard Cartwright, Mr. Chaffin and other distinguished lights in the Liberal ranks have been howling for "Commercial Union," "Continental Free Trade," "Unrestricted Free Trade" and half a dozen other fads, all having in view the development of trade with the United States as opposed to the development of trade with the Mother Country which Conservative Governments always strove to encourage.

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
