# LATE SPORT NEWS

## JOE THOMAS OUTPOINTED BOBBY EBER

Buffalo Boxer Accorded Popular Decision Over Hamilton Battler... Young Crowley Shows Class.

There is a gloomy shadow lurking about the half-mowing factory in Hamilton of Hank Woods, as an aftermath of the boxing bouts staged at the Armouries last night before an audience of about five hundred under the auspices of the Great War Veterans Hank and his stable arrived yesterday afternoon with the air of "We'll show 'em how to fight" but departed on a late train with the taunt "We'll show you next time."  
The first bout billed for four rounds between Young Crowley of Hamilton and Joe Goodman of Buffalo was short and sweet. Although Joe might be a "Goodman" he was no match for the Ambitious City lad notwithstanding he had four and a half pounds the best in weight. Crowley had Goodman going from the gong and put him down twice for a count of eight and three before he landed the slumber poke, thus ending the argument in the first round.  
The second bout of four rounds in which Young Murray of Hamilton and Willie Hewitt of Buffalo were the principals, ended in the second round by what might pass for a knock out, at any rate Murray went to the mat and took the count.

**One Good Bout.**  
The third bout which was to have been a six round affair between Irish Kennedy of Hamilton and Herman Smith, premier featherweight of Buffalo, did not materialize as the Mountain Town Irishman was "knocked out" by the "fin" so Young McMullen also of Hamilton took his place and the fans were given six good rounds of the fistic art. This was the first appearance of McMullen before a local audience and he left a very favorable impression. He is a clean, fair and square above board boxer and although he was against an old ring artist he held his own and a shade better. The bout went the full six rounds.

The main bout of the show brought two favorites of the local fans together, Bobby Eber, the Hamilton Whirlwind and Joe Thomas of the Bison City, who put up a first class bout. Dickie Dundee of Buffalo was to have been Eber's opponent but on account of breaking a bone in his right hand was unable to come, and sent Thomas as a substitute, who put up a good fight, notwithstanding the fact that he fought a fast four round bout with Elhow's McPadden in Buffalo on Monday night. The first two rounds were a little slow, and Eber drew the audience with his kangaroo stunts, while Thomas practically played on the defense, but in the tail end five he went at Eber hammer and tongs and it was the consensus of opinion that he outpointed Eber. Several times Thomas backed to the ropes as if tiring, and then push out his right that invariably sent Eber's head several degrees backwards. However, Eber was game and came right back with a left jab which usually connected with Thomas' nose, but lacked the required pressure of steam, only causing that retaliatory smile to come over the Buffalo lad's face. It was a red hot tilt.

**The Next Show.**  
Jack Loney, the pride of St. Kitts fight fans, who was a ringside spectator was called to the roped square, when it was announced that in two weeks, the G. W. V. A. intended staging another show when Loney and Pete Scott, the Hamilton Indian would figure in the main bout. The last time these two boxers met in this city they fought a draw.  
Dan Rogers of Buffalo acted as referee and gave entire satisfaction.

**MORE CHANGES.**  
By the time those Albany legislators get through mutilating the Gibbs boxing bill, it won't resemble its original form any more than an elephant resembles a flea. More amendments were submitted last night by Mr. Gibbs, one providing for the elimination of judges to make decisions and substituting the referee as the sole arbitrator. Ten per cent. of the gross receipts are to go to the state, and clubs of first class cities must put up a cash bond of \$10,000 as a guarantee of good faith. Just why a \$10,000 bond will not serve the same purpose has not been explained by Mr. Gibbs thus far. But a cash deposit will not keep any bona fide, well meaning organization out of the promoting game.
