## German Plots In Boston.

PROVIDED FOR WIDE ATTACKS

Boston, Feb. 15.—The chief of a group of private investigators employed by New England manufacturers engaged in turning out war material for the Allies last night told of an astonishing chain of disclosures which resulted from several months' investigation of the charge that secret agents, who had headquarters in Boston, were plotting for the destrucion of munition plants.

The agents have now fled to Monreal, and the chief of the detectives left last night for that city. According to his story, a veritable reign of terror extending over several months was prepared. Factories were to be burned or dynamited in the heights of their activities. Workmen were to be frightened from shops where supplies for the Allies were being made, and no expense or danger was to be spared to the end that shipments to the Entente Powers might be stopped

Four plants, he says, were marked or early destruction. The New Eng land Manufacturing Company at Woburn, which is working night and day turning out chemical components for high explosives, was to be dynamited on February 16, by a well-dressed man, ostensibly calling on a matter of

The Union stock yards at Watertown, now used by the French- Canada Company, one of the principal shippers of horses to the Allies, was to be burned about February 21, through the explosion of high-power- ange Pulp in tins.

Peanut Butter Smacks, a delicious confection, 30c. lb. ed combustible bombs that were to be sent into the yards enclosed in baled

Within the next few days, although no definite time was set, the plant of the United States Cartridge Company at Lowell, was to be dynamited, to the end that the manufacture of rifle shells might be stopped.

On March 10, according to the hief's story, a bomb was to be placed n the central power plant of the General Electric Company's river works at Lynn. The conspirators toped to destroy generators that ould not be replaced within a year, and thereby hold up operations in the ouildings that are now making shell cases, fuse caps, torpedo heads and similar metallic parts for ammuni-

The plot was conceived and prepared the investigator says, by expert emists and other trained men of ngenious minds. They were well upplied with money and spared no effort or expense to gain information the campaign could be carried on effectively and with minimum danger

The trail, he said, first led to New ort News, Virginia, where the France Canada Company had its principal station before opening the Watertown

There the conspirators maintained an office under the guise of an advertising concern. A woman operain the building and found the office to be filled with maps and other data concerning the marked factories. Later a dictagraph was installed, and through this instrument the first definite information of the plot was obfained.

In time the secret agents, always wary and suspicious ,transferred their office to a New York hotel patronized by business men. There they continned their plotting.
