French Hospital Ship Finishes Season's Work.

The French hospital ship *Ste. Jeanne d'Arc*, which ministers to the members of the French fishing fleet on the Banks, arrived in port yesterday afternoon and is making her last visit to this port before returning to France, says the North Sydney Herald of Thursday last.

The *Ste. Jeanne d'Arc* has had a busy season during her stay on the Banks this year and her record of mercy is highly praised by the members of the fishing fleet, who have visited here from time to time on the French trawlers and other craft of the fleet. Not only has the ship ministered to their sickness, but has saved many from death, who strayed from their ships in open boats. She has also been the mail carrier of the fleet. During the season just closed the *Ste. Jeanne d'Arc* made 760 visits to vessels. Treated 433 patients of the fishing fleet. Entered 97 cots in her hospital ward. Picked up 28 sailors, who had got separated from their ships and were liable to death from exposure in open dories. Delivered 47,000 letters to the French fleet and picked up the home going mail. The *Ste. Jeanne d'Arc* will remain in port here and at Sydney, for a few days, and will then proceed to France, calling on ships of the fleet and at the French islands enroute.

N.F. Banking Skipper Breaks Record.

8500 Quintals Taken Since April by
Thorahill.

La Havy, N.S., Sept. 21.—The Nova Scotia fisherman Marian Belle Wolfe in command of Captain J. Thorahill, now in port, is said to have broken all records of the Nova Scotia and Newfoundland fishing fleets by taking more than 8,500 quintals of fish since April 8, when she sailed for the Banks. The majority of the Lunenburg county fishing fleet have returned from their final trips this season to the fishing grounds.

Flying Workshop Will Accompany Plane in Air.

London.—There is now being built for the Air Ministry the first flying stores and workshop ever constructed in this country. The machine has a large fuselage and is to be used to carry spare parts with operating air fleets. This will avoid the necessity of an airplane having to return to headquarters to obtain the requisite spare parts for repairs when some slight trouble has developed, or as an alternative, having to make a forced landing. If a pilot, when flying on manoeuvres, develops "trouble" of some sort, he will signal to the flying workshop which will carry spare parts of the type that are being used by the unit. The two machines will then alight in some suitable place where the necessary work can be done. As soon as the first flying workshop is completed and satisfactorily tested, a number of similar craft will be built.
