

**Left-Handers Squint?**

Record of Some Striking Cases.

Handed people may be distressed to hear that, according to the experience of Dr. W. S. Inman, of the Portsmouth and South Hants Ear Hospital, such a habit is usually associated with squinting.

Noticing that several squinted patients were left-handed, even when not left-handed, he makes a large proportion of the cases had left-handed relatives. Inman made further investigation into the relations between handedness and left-handedness.

He has been able (he writes in Lancet) to collect 1,000 cases of which very few of which have failed to reveal the existence of left-handedness or stammering in some relative.

Left-handedness in a bowler or man, as Dr. Inman remarks, may be useful; but in most cases where it shows a tendency to use the right hand, the habit is laughed or sneered away by parents or teachers who have not recognized that it is such a thing as a left-handed temperament, and that it interferes with it may be dangerous.

**Effect of a Whipping.**

The left-hander be compared with the rest of his family, brought by the same parents, it will be found that he is generally distinguished by being to a greater degree than his fellows self-reliant, obstinate, refusing to be guided, but accepting guidance from those he loves.

Squint apparently, may predispose towards left-handedness in a child, as in one case, noted by Dr. Inman, of a boy of seven who has squinted since the age of two.

He was right-handed until he was six, when he became very friendly with a left-handed boy, and began to imitate him, even to the extent of writing with the left hand.

His habit was 'broken' by the parents. No other squint, stammer, or handedness could be traced in the family.

On the other hand," says Dr. Inman, "I have known of only one case where a left-hander developed a habit which an attempt was made to correct right-handedness. A boy seven or eight was sent to a school where the master insisted on his writing right-handed. The boy had difficulty in compliance, was scolded, and at each beating developed temporary squint."

Stammering sometimes has followed an attempt to enforce right-handedness, and also from an attempt to make a right-handed person left-handed.

**Critical and Obstinate.**

An elderly father of strong personality, who is keenly interested in his daughter, had a right-handed daughter, whom he taught to use her left hand without much difficulty. Under the influence of a certain undesirable sequelae. An attempt to educate in the same way as she was born two or three years ago had to be abandoned owing to the development of a stammer."

The very striking case of relationship between left-handedness and squint might be called a family squint, and by Dr. Inman, is that of a seven-year-old child, the daughter of a naval officer, who suddenly became left-handed after a whipping. The child was chastised for being naughty.

Later in the day, when good reasons appeared to have been given, she was invited to play some invented in the family. Over a perforated seat of a chair was stretched a piece of paper, and the father tried to pierce the paper over the holes with a lead pencil. The father tried first, and then passed the pencil to his daughter, who did it and struck with it in her left hand.

When she did this a second time, the father commented upon it and tried to persuade her to use the right hand in place of the left, but without success.

This was the first occasion on which any sign of left-handedness had been given. In this family the father has a tendency to divergent squint, the mother's only brother has pronounced convergent squint, in one or two of the other children there is a suggestion of divergent squint, and the mother, though not left-handed, uses mirror writing in making private notes.—Tit-Bits.
