At Birrell & Johnston's sale, 24th October, the average on cattle reached \$225 each. Sheep, however, brought very high prices, ewes and ewe lambs going from \$20 up to \$230 per pair. They were extra fine, and the whole flock weas put up and sold. Two Clydesdale stallions, recently imported, only brought \$550 and \$500 respectively.
