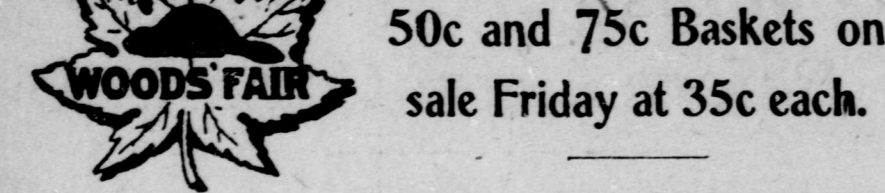

MANY BUILDINGS BURNED AT HULL UNITED MINERS WILL CONVENE

Fire Destroys 34 Residences in a Few Hours. TWO HUNDRED ARE HOMELESS

For a Time the Flames Threatened the City of Ottawa, Causing Much Uneasiness. They Declare the Men's Representatives on the Board Were Not Properly Treated.

Ottawa, June 4.—Thirty-four buildings destroyed and over 200 people homeless is the record of a fire which swept streets bordering on Lake Minnow, in the city of Hull, yesterday afternoon. Hull rests on a series of limestone ledges, with depressions here and there, in which are small bodies of water dignified with the name of lake. Bordering on Lake Minnow were Autumn, Chaudiere, Rock, Burke and Larrie streets. On these streets were the small and humble abodes of the French-Canadian laborers, and in two hours 34 of them were reduced to ashes.
