M. C. R. Very Careful.

Windsor Record: The greatest precaution is being taken by the authorities of the Michigan Central Railway, as it cost the M. C. R. six times the value of black gunpowder to deliver it to one of the local hardware merchants. Since that explosion at Essex, they are somewhat timid in handling explosives of all kinds. It is probable the Michigan Central will soon positively refuse to handle explosives unless they can make a fair profit, instead of losing on every shipment.

Appeal Dismissed.

At Osgoode Hall Thursday in the divisional court, before Meredith, C.J., MacMahon, J., Teetzel, J., Reid vs. Shuttleworth, J. B. McKillop, London, for defendant, appealed from judgment of senior judge of county court, of Middlesex, upon the findings of a jury, in favor of plaintiff for the recovery of \$200 damages in an action for wrongful dismissal of plaintiff from the employment of defendant as forewoman of the millinery department of his factory in the city of London. The jury found that defendant engaged plaintiff for the season and that defendant was not justified in dismissing plaintiff. I. F. Hellmuth, K.C., for plaintiff, opposed appeal. Dismissed with costs.

Learned a Lesson.

Stratford Herald: A young man residing in Stratford knows more about customs regulations now than he did a few days ago. He was in Detroit recently and took a suit to a friend of his in the cleaning and repairing business to have it attended to. When he was ready to leave the suit was not done, and he directed it to be sent to him by express. When the clothes came he did not have to pay duty on them, because they had been worn, but he had to pay 35 per cent on \$3, the bill for repairs. There may be others who have not heretofore known that repairs to a Canadian article done in a foreign country are liable to duty when the article is brought back to Canada. Of course, if the young man had worn the suit back, and put the one he was wearing in his valise or trunk, the customs officers would not have charged him any duty at the border.

A former Stratfordite in Detroit, writing to the Beacon, comments upon the financial situation as it appears to him in the City of the Straits. The correspondent says in part: "There has not been such a time in Detroit for years. It seems there is plenty of work to be had, but the employers cannot get the money out of the banks to pay the men. The banks put up a notice last week that depositors would have to give the full 60-days' notice before they could draw from their accounts. Some of the employers are paying in clearing house checks, and when you go to a store to have them cashed 5 to 7 per cent interest is asked to do so.
