John Cooper Powys Declares Human Race Will Be Vast Industrial Army.

SEES MONEY'S ABOLITION

Work Coupons Will Succeed It in Socialistic Utopia, Conjeered Up by Lecturer.

That the republic of the future will be a socialistic state with government by commission, the human race formed into a vast industrial army, and the unit in society composed not of a man and his wife and children, but entirely of the individual, were some of the conclusions arrived at, and convictions voiced by John Cowper Powys, M. A., in his lecture last night on "The Republic of the Future."

Mr. Powys reached this climax by asking his hearers to consider first the great world movements of the day. That there were these movements and continual changes politically, morally and socially, no one could deny. It had been the case since the world began.

"In history there have been great movements existing for a time; they have played their part and then vanished completely away, leaving, so far as one can see no trace on the future of the world. It is therefore quite conceivable that there are even now existing great moral, political and even revolutionary movements that will in time disappear and leave no trace," said Mr. Powys.

"So in discussing the republic of the future, we must consider what particular currents now existing are going to be master. Obviously, they are in embryo now, for nothing ever sprang out of the void all at once.

Religious Movements.

"Look abroad over the world. You see certain great religions—Christian, Buddhism, Mohammedanism, Confucianism and so on. A great many people realize that Christianity is not making the headway that they would have hoped. Is the coming into the Christian fold of the Buddhist, Mohammedan and all the rest so great and so rapid that we are compelled to think that within a limited space of time all the world will accept Christianity? I do not know," said Mr. Powys. "But if there happens to appear simultaneously among Christians, Mohammedans, Confucianists and Buddhists-among every conceivable kind of race the world over, in fact, a similar movement, is this not what we are in search of? I do not see how anybody can deny that in every coun-

try in the world at present there are two forces at work. One is socialism, he other individualism or philosophic Of these two, Mr. Prowys, deemed socialism by far the greater influence, and averred that the socialistic ideal would govern the republic of the future, although philosophic anarchy might dominate later. The tendency of the present age was commercialism, industrialism and competition. This latter phase of commercial life was rapidly becoming eliminated, however, by scientific organization. One by one certain "Napoleonic-Bismarkic"

brains were taking up the threads of commerce and high finance, and in the organzation of trusts competition was becomng less and less. "What is this pooling of capital and

labor but socialism in the germ?" asked the speaker. Experts in Finance.


In his ideal state with government by commission, Mr. Powys would have his commissioners experts in finance, who should each be in power for ten years. encouraged graft, rescality, and meanness, and has hindered over and over again the will of the people." Would Give Leisure.

Under the new system of things as forseen by Mr. Powys, the republic of the future will give much leisure to the people. The working day shall be of no more than four hours' duration. Coin of the realm shall cease to exist; and in place of money, mankind will obtain food and clothing at a great state department-store by presenting coupons stating the number of hours which he has worked. In this state there will be no chance for the "man higher up" to grind down the man beneath. The pinch that is felt by the unskilled laborer of today will be a thing unknown. "I would rather be a slave in the courts of Nero of old, than an unskilled laborer under present conditions, said Mr. Powys.

Woman's Standing.

Woman's standing in the new republic will be a much more independent one than is at present the case, according to Mr. Powys. A husband will not dare beat his wife, because she will be considered as a distinctive unit by the state, and as such receive the state's protection. "A mother and wife will be units-not dependent upon the man. For every child born into the world the mother will receive a stated sum from the government, and this will render her independent."

With a vision of free theaters, free nusic of the best kind, free picture galleries, and plenty of leisure for the human race, Mr. Powys concluded his picture of the Republic of the Future.
