Joins Toronto Office of Ad Firm

WITH a long and varied experience in journalism and many other phases of publicity and propaganda work, W. A. Willison has joined the Toronto office of McConnell & Fergusson, Limited.
Mr. Willison's newspaper career began in Vancouver, where he worked on the staff of the News-Advertiser. For four years he was associated with the Toronto "News," and when the war began he was resident correspondent of that paper in London, England. He was appointed accredited war correspondent with Cooks Tours, but returned to Canada in 1917 to take charge of the educational and propaganda department of the Food Controller, during organization and after, under the late Hon. W. J. Hanna.

In September of that year he resigned to become war correspondent for the Canadian Press, Limited, at Canadian Corps Headquarters in France, and in Belgium during the Passchendaele operations.

Since his return from France Mr. Willison has been in charge of the editorial department of the Canadian Reconstruction Association, in which he showed a strong grasp of economic and financial problems.

YOUTH DROWNS IN EAST OXFORD

Alfred Guttman, 16-Year-Old English Boy, Seized With Cramps.

Had Been Employed On Slattery Farm, South of Eastwood.

WOODSTOCK, June 12.—Alfred Guttman, a young English boy who was brought to this country some years ago by the Barnardo Home, was seized with cramps while in swimming on Sunday afternoon, and was drowned. He had been employed by Philip Slattery, four miles south of Eastwood, and was 16 years of age. The drowning took place in the creek

near the quarter town line of East Oxford, where the boy, with a number of others, had gone to swim. The body was not recovered until this morning.

An inquest was held this evening, and a verdict of accidental death was brought in by the coroner's jury. Two criminal cases and a civil case constitute the docket for the regular summer sessions of the county court, which opens at the courthouse here this afternoon before Judge Wallace.

Frank Lince of Stratford who is an inmate of the jail, is arraigned for a serious offence. Dr. Herbert E. Service of Tillsonburg is charged with bigamy.

The civil case is an adjournment of J. N. Miller of Tillsonburg vs. Frank McCloy of Dereham, and concerns an action for damage in regard to cutting certain timber, and an action for assault.

DIES AS RESULT OF CAR HITTING TREE

Toronto, June 13.—Suffering from a badly fractured skull, which he received when his heavy touring car crashed into a maple tree near the corner of Jamestown avenue and Empress Crescent at 11:10 last night, Joseph Perugini, aged 27, a taxicab driver, residing at 635 Ontario street, died from his injuries in the Western Hospital at 3:05 this morning.

Four other taxi drivers who accompanied him escaped little or no injury.

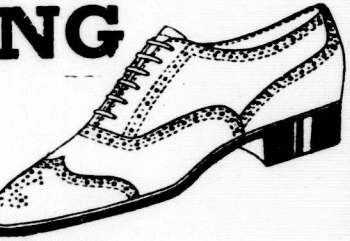
