The Fight For Hydro Power

If the people of New Brunswick are awake to the real facts in the fight which the Veniot Government is waging to give them the full benefits of hydro power, then there is not one seat in the Province which will not send it a supporter.

It was the Liberal Gevernment which first undertook hydro development and its plant at Musquash reduced the cost of electricity for domestic purposes from twelve cents which were paid under private control to less than four cents, with a greater relative cost for industrial purposes.

The Liberal Government was the first Government to refuse to continue the giving of a lease to private interests at Grand Falls, but in the face of great opposition claimed the power in the interests of the public and is now going forward with the en-

Just how bitter and sinister have been the opposition which the Government has had to overcome is not fully known. A campaign was begun by the private interests to show that the development would not pay. This, time has definitely disproved. It was claimed that the cost to the people would not be less than under private ownership. The people know better now, for even the private concern in St. John has been forced to go from twelve cents to lower than four cents. It was claimed that Musquash would not furnish sufficient power, but last year with the driest summer and winter in fifty years, the power did not fail. When these measures failed then darker methods were adopted. Interruptions to the service occurred which were traced quite definitely to vandal hands.

In the Grand Falls development the same history is to be told. The private interests who sought to retain their hold have adopted all kinds of measures in order to regain their hold, and their one supreme chance is the defeat of the Veniot

Where do the people stand? With the Government who are fighting for the people's rights or with the Opposition and the private interests?

Mark the point well!! Neither Leader Baxter nor one solitary candidate in his party has declared that the Grand Falls power shall not be controlled by private interests. On the other hand, Veniot and every one of his candidates stand pledged for Government control, which means so much to certain parts of the province.

Do the people of Restigouche desire cheap hydro power for the establishment of pulp and paper and other mills. If they do, then let Restigouche send two supporters of the Veniot Government to Freder-
