MANY BREAKS IN THE PIPE.

A Tour of Inspection Made by The World.

The Citizens Are Now Drinking Copious Draughts of Bay Water—Capt. Goodwin Reports.

The Mishap Fully as Bad as Reported. The citizens are now drinking copious draughts of bay water. Capt. Goodwin reports that the mishap is fully as bad as reported. Many breaks in the pipe have been discovered. A tour of inspection was made by The World.

The news exclusively published in The World yesterday respecting the mishap to the new steel conduit which supplies the city has not been a source of excitement in the city for many a day. Unfortunately, investigations made yesterday proved that the mishap was fully as disastrous as had been feared. Not only has the pipe been broken in several places, but the conduit has been damaged in places, and from one end to the other the water which has been pumped into the well during the last 40 hours has been bay water, utterly unfit for use.

At present it is simply impossible to estimate the damage occasioned. While Superintendent Hamilton and Engineer Keating are hopeful that the damage is only a few thousand dollars will cover, which are afraid that the portions of the pipe which have not yet been examined, and which are under the ice, may be broken. Should such be the case the entire pipe should be taken up, re-joined, and re-laid, and the expense will run into the hundreds of thousands.
