Hogs are lower in price on the local market. Live hogs are now selling at \$9.25 and dressed at \$12.50 to \$13.50 hundredweight. Live and dressed beef and mutton were steady.

Four or five issues were outstanding for activity. Brazilian Traction showed a further decline of over 20 cents and was 1/2 lower at 5 1/2.

Domestic Canners and Toronto Railway each lost 1/2 at 3 1/2 and 1 1/2, respectively. Bank issues all sold unchanged except Montreal, which was a point lower at 17 1/2.
