cal apparatus.

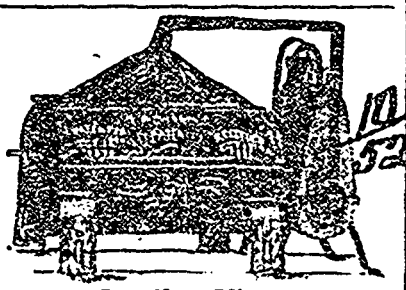

A Bill has been passed under the statute, increasing the number of Directors, and the following
gentlemen—**JAMES DEALY, Esq.,** Q.C., M.P., ex-Mayor of Toronto, **L. SAMUEL, Esq.,** of the firm of
M & L Samuel, Benjamin & Co. Toronto, **JOHN PULTON, Esq.,** M.D., Professor Trinity Medical Col-
lege—have expressed their readiness to go on the Board of Directors of the Company.

The Company is incorporated "to refine and deal in all kinds of sugars and syrups," and while large pro-
fits have been made in refining cane sugars, still larger profits have been made in the manufacture of glucose
and grape sugar. The Company also has power to make and deal in starch and other products of grain. The
main business of the Company will be the manufacture of glucose and grape sugar.

It is proposed to begin work on a moderate scale, and enlarge the works as the requirements of the busi-
ness demand.

The Buffalo Grape Sugar Company was organized on the 10th January, 1874, with a capital stock of
\$100,000 divided into 200 shares of \$500 each. In February, 1880, an action was commenced in the Superior
Court at Buffalo to recover the value of twenty three of these shares. The case was tried before a jury, who
found in favour of the plaintiff, and awarded him the sum of \$17,125 as being the value of the twenty-three
shares, this was some \$10,744.50 for cash \$100 share, or over \$700 for every \$1.

The document proving this can be seen at our office. The shareholders of the above Company have taken
upon themselves the unlimited liability of an ordinary partnership, sooner than make the returns required by
the State law, and declare the actual profits made by them in the business.

A leading town in Ontario has voted a bonus of \$5,000. The situation is also most favourable for business,
both in Ontario and the North-West.

The stock is to be fully paid up and a deposit of ten per cent. is required with each application for stock,
the balance being payable in monthly instalments of fifteen per cent. cash. Shareholders can pay up their
stock in full at once if they wish to do so.

The first dividend will be adjusted in accordance with the times the payments are made on the stock.
At the present prices of corn and syrups a factory can make a profit of some \$12,000 per annum for every
100 bushels per day capacity; but even one-half of this profit would be a very large return upon the capital
required.

While it is proposed not to work more than 500 or 600 bushels of corn per day at first, yet the factory will
be erected so that 800 or 1,000 bushels per day can be worked with very little extra expense.

The consumption has increased enormously in the States, and if it is taken at the same rate per head in
Canada as in the States, it would keep a 5,000 bushel factory working day and night to meet the demand,
while we also have the growing market in the great North-West.

It may be asked, is not glucose injurious? The answer is that a well-made glucose is a wholesome article
of food, all starch foods being changed into glucose in the process of digestion. The impurities which have
been charged upon glucose are in reality those of the cane syrups with which it is mixed. This is shown by
digesting both kinds of syrups, when cane syrup will be found to yield from three per cent. to five per cent. of
ash, while glucose gives so small a quantity that it is almost unweighable.

For table syrups the glucose has, according to the grade required, added to it a varying quantity of cane
sugar syrup. These syrups are known as corn syrups, and, on account of their cheapness and quality, have
almost driven the cane syrups out of the market. The consumers, as a matter of taste, prefer the glucose to
the cane syrup.
