No tender will be received unless made on
printed forms furnished by the Department.
The material of all articles will be required
to be of Canadian manufacture and of Cana-
dian workmanship.

Each tender must be accompanied by an
accepted Canadian bank cheque, for an
amount equal to 10 per cent of the total
value of the articles tendered for, which will
be forfeited if the party making the tender
declines to sign a contract when called upon
to do so, or if he fails to complete the service
contracted for. If the tender be not ac-
cepted, the cheque will be returned.
