### SUBSIDIZED INDUSTRIES IN CONSTITUENCY OF VILLENEUVE

**Question No. 3,276—Mr. Caouette (Villeneuve):**

1. Has the Department of Regional Economic Expansion subsidized industries established in the Constituency of Villeneuve since the establishment of the Department and, if so, what was the annual amount?

2. For each of the grants allowed to industries in the Constituency, what is the (a) name of the subsidized industry (b) amount of the grant received (c) year the grant was paid (d) number of jobs created?

**Mr. Cliff McIsaac (Parliamentary Secretary to Minister of Regional Economic Expansion):** The answer for the Department of Regional Economic Expansion is as follows: 1. Yes. Under the authority of the Regional Development Incentives Act (RDIA), the estimated total amounts offered were: 1969, None; 1970, \$717,825; 1971, \$779,105; 1972, \$594,249; 1973, \$350,484; 1974, \$3,630,649; \$199,400.

### FUNDING BY DEPARTMENT OF REGIONAL ECONOMIC EXPANSION

**Question No. 3,295—Mr. Forrestall:**

1. How many announcements concerning funding were made by the Ministers of Regional Economic Expansion in Ottawa (a) alone (b) jointly with others between September 30, 1973 and September 30, 1975?

2. For the same period, how many such announcements were made by (a) Cabinet Ministers (b) other Members of Parliament?

**Mr. Cliff McIsaac (Parliamentary Secretary to Minister of Regional Economic Expansion):** The answer for the Department of Regional Economic Expansion is as follows: 1. (a) 217. (b) 113 (i.e., in conjunction with federal cabinet ministers, provincial premiers, provincial cabinet ministers and municipal officials).

2. (a) (33) (11) on behalf of the Minister of Regional Economic Expansion.

### PURCHASING OF CANNED MACKEREL

**Question No. 3,334—Mr. Marshall:**

Under the two million dollar purchase programme for canned mackerel, would the minister give a list of the producers in the Atlantic Region from whom the mackerel was purchased and the total amount purchased from each producer?

**Mr. George Baker (Parliamentary Secretary to Minister of the Environment and Minister of Fisheries):** Under the "Bridging" Program designed to assist the Canadian fishing industry during 1975, the Fisheries Prices Support Board was authorized to purchase canned mackerel from the 1975 pack for use in international food aid and development programs of the Canadian International Development Agency (CIDA) and the World Food Program (WFP). Due to extremely low mackerel landings in 1975 however, no canned mackerel was delivered to the Fisheries Prices Support Board.
