Hon. Norman A. Cafik (Minister of State (Multiculturalism)): 1. There are over 6,000 names on the mailing list, which includes persons across Canada, individuals from the media, ethnic organizations, ethnic press, members of the Canadian Consultative Council on Multiculturalism and members of the general public who make enquiries.

2. As inquiries for information and assistance from the Multiculturalism Programme are addressed to, and processed by, not only the Multiculturalism Directorate but also through offices of the Minister for Multiculturalism and the Secretary of State, the Departmental Secretariat and all regional and local offices of the Department of the Secretary of State, such information is not readily available. It would involve an inordinate amount of work at significant cost to gather such data.
