After all, the most appropriate way to commemorate the Dante Centenary is to study Dante's works and the language in which he wrote.

"An Outline of Dante Study" will prove to be of value as indicating the ground to be covered. Another outline has been issued as a reading course by the Home Education Division of the Bureau of Education, Department of the Interior, Washington. Those who wish to go into the subject more deeply may consult Professor Wilkins' "One Hundred Dante Books."

Of the English translations of the "Divina Commedia," the National Dante Committee especially recommends that by Professor Charles Eliot Norton, a centenary edition of which, in one volume, is being issued by Houghton Mifflin Company at the request of the National Dante Committee.
