### **Procellaria pelagica.**

#### **STORMY PETREL.**

This is rarely seen very near to our shores, but Mr. CORY found it quite common a short distance at sea off the Gulf of St. Lawrence. It is occasionally observed off Labrador and Nova Scotia, and one example has been taken at the mouth of the Bay of Fundy.

### **Oceanodroma furcata.**

#### **FORK-TAILED PETREL.**

A Pacific bird, common off the west coast of Vancouver Island.

### **Oceanodroma leucorhoa.**

#### **LEACH'S PETREL.**

An abundant bird on both the Atlantic and Pacific coasts.

---

### **Oceanites oceanicus.**

#### **WILSON'S PETREL.**

Occurs on the Atlantic coast, from the Bay of Fundy to Northern Labrador.

---

### **Phaëthon flavirostris.**

#### **YELLOW-BILLED TROPIC BIRD.**

An example of this species, taken at Shubenacadie, N. S., September 6, 1870, is preserved in the Halifax Museum.
