Final Agreement on McKittick Deal Will Be Submitted Tonight.

HAMILTON, Tuesday, June 29.—McKittick affairs have been the bone of contention for so long at the city hall that Mayor Walters is determined to make sure that they do not crop up in the future thru any mistake of the present administration.

The final agreement between the two parties over the bonds to be issued that the municipality gets the \$150,000 it spent on the west end bridge will be submitted to the city council tonight.

Mayor Walters is receiving a signed document from W. J. Southan and others interested, stating that they are satisfied with the agreement and that it is what they understood at the last conference.

FIRE DEPARTMENT STILL AWAITS HEAD

No Action Taken by Council Regarding Reorganization.

WIND UP ASSOCIATION

Municipal Loan Caused Warm Criticism of Civic Business Methods.

Another meeting of the city council has gone by without anything being done towards the reorganization of the fire department, either as regards the appointing of a commissioner or the amendments thought necessary to the pension fund bylaw. Mayor Church introduced a letter in which he suggested that the fire department be placed under Commissioner of Works R. C. Harris, but no action was taken, and the long deferred motions of Ald. Walton and Youngblood regarding the pension fund were again laid over, which means that another two weeks will go to the works department before the most important item of yesterday's proceedings was a discussion as to whether the Municipal Loan Association should be wound up or not, it being finally decided to hold a further conference on the matter.

The bylaw authorizing the regulation and licensing of jitneys was referred back for further consideration, and while the bylaw authorizing the extension of Queen street, west of Sunnyside, was passed by James E. Day on behalf of Sunnyside Orphanage, the bylaw will be continued in about two weeks' time. The bylaw for the expropriation of the necessary land between a large deputation waited on council protesting against the charging of the new pavement on Kingston avenue north of Bloor street, a local improvement, and in view of this the bylaw authorizing the construction of the new street was referred back for further consideration.

Capt. McSherry wrote protesting against the bylaw being introduced regarding the licensing of jitneys. As a result the bylaw only received one reading and will be further considered and possibly amended before it is brought up in council again.

Ald. Dunn objected to the board of control's recommendation that all laundry licenses be dealt with by the property commissioner, but despite this all such licenses will be dealt with by the commissioner.

The recommendation of Commissioner Harris that certain works be turned over to contractors instead of being done by the works department, which has been a subject of considerable opposition as well as some support and council, after deciding to have the department do the work while sitting as the committee of the whole, reversed the decision when the committee rose and voted in favor of turning the work over to the contractors.

German Beer Sign. The German beer sign was again food for discussion, the works committee having reported in favor of its staying up. The mayor repeated what he has said on other occasions, that Cameron delivered an oration on signs generally. "They are infernal and dangerous things on our streets," he said. The works committee will be allowed to discuss the matter again.

Ald. Robbins introduced a motion that the Acting Chief of Police be made chief, and Ald. McBride said that he had charges against the acting chief for carrying out his duties. The motion was carried and stands as notice of motion.

The affairs of the Municipal Loan Association were discussed at the afternoon session. It was introduced by a letter from the association contained in the report and recommendation from the board and a recommendation from the board that the association be allowed to wind up or continue its affairs as it sees fit without interference from the board of control. In his letter Ald. Nicholson, who introduced the suggestion that the affairs of the association be taken over by the city, the name to be operated as a civic department, or, as an alternative, that it be wound up.

Borrowed Too Much. During a discussion which was brought out that the association sold bonds to the extent of \$100,000 at 6 per cent; the balance amount is out in an excellent bill acting as an interest on the bank at 3 per cent. The monthly debt of the association is now \$417.50, and it is estimated that the monthly debt will be \$450.00 instead of \$100,000.

In Ald. Robbins' opinion, the association has been an absolute failure, because it has been worse than a failure, and it has been a failure in every respect, according to Controller Spence, and said "we have come to a mess of it, and I think they have made a mess of it, and Controller Spence thinks we should leave the mess to them, and they are in a mess. It is our business to get into it. We allowed them to get into this undertaking, and we should not let them go on." The alderman continued by saying that he thought the association was a disgrace to the city, as the city had virtually gone into the business at the rate of 12 per cent per annum, and it has educated people to the point where they have never gone to such places before.

Not Measured by Money. Ald. Maguire was strongly against casting any insinuation at the men who had given their time to the work of the association. He didn't think that the value of the work done during the past winter could be measured in dollars and cents, as many a man had been saved from losing his home, as money had been advanced to make the payments due.

Ald. Roden pointed out that while the association was being operated at a loss, the city had "three times as much more money in relief work by having the association as it was being operated, without the same amount of per cent good. He was in favor of the work of the association being carried on.

POLICE PROTECTION FOR WEST FAIRBANK

Ratepayers Declare Policing System Inadequate and Urge Further Measures.

WOMEN ARE ACCOSTED

Petty Thieving in District Has Made Increased Vigilance Imperative.

A meeting of the West Fairbank Ratepayers' Association was held last evening in Caledonia Hall, when the question of police protection for the district was discussed, together with other matters pertaining to the district.

W. Heathfield stated that a number of strange men had been loitering on Caledonia road of late, and considerable thieving is going on. He pointed out that the district has been broken open and a large number of chickens stolen. A lady whose husband and sons have gone to the front was pointing out the neighborhood in consequence of being frightened by men prowling around her premises late at night.

Chairman W. Ryder suggested that a special constable might be installed in West Fairbank. There has been a score of men off the front from the section and in consequence several other members spoke of thefts from their back premises.
