Troops who hire themselves out to let from the King of G - B— to the E— of H—. are absolutely against the Constitution of this Kingdom, and appear like common Kerry Stones in our Imperial Diadem, among a great many real and inestimable Jewels;—if we were but allowed to have a Crown of our own.
