

and report on all petitions for Charters for Subordinate Divisions, having in view the question how far new Divisions, in places where Divisions are already located, will affect the latter.

4. The Committee on Appeals shall consist of five members, to whom shall be referred all appeals, and all complaints of grievances, misdemeanors, or violations of order in any of the Subordinate Divisions.

5.—*Sect. 1.* The Committee on Constitutions and Bye-laws shall consist of three members, to whom shall be referred, when reference is deemed needful, all matters of doubt and dispute concerning constitutional questions, and all Bye-laws proposed to be adopted hereafter by the G. D., or by any Subordinate Division.

*Sect. 2.* Each Subordinate Division shall submit a certified copy of all Bye-laws which they desire to adopt, to the examination of the Committee on Constitutions and Bye-laws, appointed as aforesaid by the Grand Division; and the said Bye-laws shall not be finally adopted by any Division unless the approbation of the said committee has been expressed in relation to the same.

6. The Committee on Credentials shall consist of three members, whose duty it shall be to examine and report on the regularity and sufficiency, or irregularity and insufficiency, of credentials of Representatives to this Grand Division.

7. The Printing Committee shall consist of three members, whose duty it shall be to superintend and contract for all printing the G. D. may order.

8. The Committee on Halls shall consist of one member for each district where sessions of G. D. may be appointed to be held during the ensuing year: each member of the committee shall, when needful, seek a suitable place for holding the meetings of the G. D., engage the same when directed, superintend the necessary preparations, and have the general oversight and charge of the room, with its furniture.
