WHEAT MARKET

Sharp Advance in May Wheat Deferred Futures Unchanged

Eleventh Hour Shorts Active on Buying Side, and Immediate Future Strengthens—Winnipeg Market Firmer.

CHICAGO, May 1.—New buying of wheat given impetus to-day because the monthly deliveries here went into strong hands. A liberal portion of the advance failed to outlast the session, but the market closed steady at prices varying from Saturday night's level to 3-4 above. Corn finished 1-1/2 to 2-4 up, oats with gain of 1-5, 1-1 to 2-4, and hog products irregular, strong, out of 2-1-2 to 2-5 decline to 2-5 higher.

Liverpool Cattle Market.

LIVERPOOL, May 1.—John Rogers & Co., Liverpool, cable to-day that the trade in the Birkenhead market, although slow, showed no appreciable difference from Saturday for both cattle and sheep, and quotations may be given as follows: State and Canadian steers, from 135c to 125c; clipped lambs, from 115c to 12c per pound.

Arrangements are now under way for the second annual Toronto Fair Stock Show to be held at the Union Stock Yards, Monday and Tuesday, Dec. 11 and 12, 1911. The popularity and success of the first show held last December has induced the management to enlarge their classification and increase the premium list. Among the new features are separate prizes for single pure bred and grade steers and heifers, separate prizes for long wool and short wool sheep and lambs; also prizes for pens of three or more of the same breed. Full particulars will appear in our columns later.

Issue Groff, who has been in the northwest during the past winter, returned to Winnipeg and bought horses at that point, shipping them to Calgary. Mr. Groff stated that he could buy horses as cheap in Winnipeg as in Ontario. Mr. Groff was also in the cattle business, buying for future shipment to Ontario.

The World asked Mr. Groff what the market was like in the northwest regarding reciprocity. His answer was: "There are many for it and many against it about equally divided and added, 'and I am neutral.
