WILLARD WOULD NOT F GHT UNTIL REFEREE SIGNED AGREEMENT

Toledo, July 11.—Oliver Pecord, referee of the Willard-Dempsey championship boxing exhibition here on July 4, today divulged the details of an agreement he claims to have been demanded by Jess Willard, to the effect that Pecord would not declare the winner if the bout went the 12 rounds limit.
