

Paris, Aug. 14 .- In connection with the proposed visit of the Shah of Persia to Europe, The Temps today says that his departure from Teheran has been hastened by feeling aroused in Teheran by the signature of an agreement with England, which in recognizing Persia's independence and integrity, scemingly will result in Great Britain being the only power to exercise influence in Persia.
