

Boxing Burns Again Beats Squires

After Tough Fight in Paris Burns Again Beats Squires

Champion Sent to the Mat in Eighth Round, and Afterwards Scores a Knockout.

PARIS, June 14.—C.A.P.)—Tommy Burns, the Canadian boxing champion of the world, had a tough fight last night with Boecher B. O. Squires. The fight at the bowling palace in Boulogne and being the night before the Grand Prix (Sunday), there was an enormous crowd in attendance.

Burns was in his second meeting, Burns having put Squires away before in the first round.

Last night Burns sent Squires down twice in the third, but after that the Australian recovered, and forced the battle somewhat, giving the champion the worst of the exchanges. Burns was known to the carpet in the eighth, but came back fiercely and by a series of body punches scored a technical knockout. The winner was enthusiastically cheered.
