WILL BATTLE ONCE MORE OVER SALARY INCREASES

Controllers Say They Will Not Discriminate in Favor of Firemen.

The battle of the civic salary increases and scale of grading is to be fought over again at to-morrow's meeting of the city council.

The board of control at a private conference in the mayor's office yesterday afternoon came to a decision to re-submit the whole report which has twice been referred back by the aldermen.

On Monday the controllers agreed to drop the attempt to carry the report, but it has changed its mind.

The reason is stated by Controller Hocken to be the heavy lobbying that is being carried on to secure the passing of the fire and light committee's new recommendations of salary increases for the fire department.

On the other hand it is said that the firemen are satisfied as a result of their canvass of the aldermen that they can get a two-thirds majority to support the committee's recommendations.

One argument which is being used against the \$500 increase for Mr. Noble is that next month he will be eligible for a retiring allowance equal to half his salary, as he will then have reached the age limit of 55.

The Deputy says, however, that he has no intention of retiring, and it is generally felt that he is fully entitled to the increase.

The appointment of a civic treasury board as proposed by the board of control, excepting the provision that the city auditor be one of the members, as it is considered that the nature of the position would not allow such a course.

The controllers recommend instead that besides the vice-chairman, another controller be appointed to the board.

No decision was reached on the mayor's suggestion that the city buy more gas stock of the new issue to be sold on Jan. 1, 1909.

The report of the special committee on the unemployed was sent on to council, altho Controller Ward opposed the clause providing only 15 cents an hour for relief.

Representatives of the York Pioneers urged that a new building be erected on the site of the old one, and were assured that this would be done.

A large deputation of residents of Bruce and Givens-streets protested against Dr. H. Wilson's recommendation that Frank Himmis be allowed to establish a slaughterhouse in that vicinity.

The Canadian Cement and Concrete Association bank at paying \$1500 as a rental for the exhibition at the Market Arena, when they intend to give an exhibition. The property commission will try to make satisfactory terms.

Peterboro Hansa Fire. The city clerk has just passed the petition for the transfer of Martin Wade's liquor shop license from West Adelaide-street to Bathurst-street.

The city solicitor is to report on the point raised as to whether a signatory whose name is on the voters' list, but who has since moved away, has a right to sign.

Judge Winchester yesterday allowed the revision of the court of revision's decision. Whiskey owners would not be compelled to pay for the extension of Albemarle-avenue until the completion of the work.

The court of revision has confirmed 107 assessments on local improvements this year subject to petition, the time for which expires Nov. 21.

\$1500 FIRE IN WHITBY.

Evaporating Works Partially Destroyed—No Insurance.

WHITBY, Oct. 27.—(Special.)—Today at noon the evaporating works of the Whitby Fruit and Vinegar Company were partially destroyed by fire.

The blaze originated from some unknown cause in the upper storey. The building was a frame structure and the roof and walls were burned to the second floor, all below that being saved.

About 250 cases of evaporators and were destroyed, also several small machines. The loss will be about \$1500, with no insurance.

BEAT AND ROBBED WIDOW.

Man Arrested is So Charged by Wife of Former Railroad Official.

NEW YORK, Oct. 27.—Accusing a man whom she had frequently met socially of having bound, gagged, beaten and robbed her of \$500 in jewelry and \$50 in cash, Mrs. Anna B. Plough, widow of a former president of the St. Paul and Duluth Railroad Company, caused the arrest of Elmer M. Swallow, a public weigher.

She said the robbery occurred in her home in Brooklyn last Friday night, only a few hours after she had been playing cards with Swallow, but that she could not bring herself to believe before this that he could be guilty of such a crime as the alleged.
