THREE COMPANIES SOON TO GO EAST

Forestry Depot Men at Camp Borden Are Preparing for Overseas

Camp Borden, June 12.—Three complete companies of the Forestry Department, consisting of a captain, four lieutenants, six sergeants, six corporals and 170 privates, have been warned for overseas and will leave in a few days for a point in eastern Canada. Owing to the short notice given, the officers are working overtime to get the necessary papers and equipment ready in time, as some of the men who will go over have only been sent to camp within the past ten days from the recruiting centres and will have to be completely outfitted here. A list of the officers to accompany the draft has been submitted to Ottawa for approval.

approval. In view of the departure of the drafts it will not be necessary to increase the strength of the unit. As previously announced, the unit will be disbanded and recommended. The unit will recruit to its former strength again.

Some Camp Orders.

Civil servants who have gone overseas with the notified unit should be discharged immediately on their return to Canada. They should advise the head of the office in which they are attached and the head of the Civil Life, in order that the necessary steps may be taken to ascertain whether they are entitled to be considered better civil or in military duties.
