The Bill of Exchange was accepted in due course; and as soon as it has been paid, the sum of fifty pounds will be placed to the credit of a book account opened between the Society, and the Niagara District Committee.

I am desired to convey to you the best thanks of the Board, for having transmitted the Report, &c. to the Society's office in London:—and I beg leave, at the same time, to offer the expression of my own good wishes for the prosperity and permanence of the District Committee. Allow me to add, that it will always afford me much pleasure to pay the utmost attention to any communications which you, or the Secretaries of the Committee may have occasion to address to the Society.
