At a meeting of the Executive Committee in February, 1857, it was resolved:

"That in future but one sermon be preached before the Society at its Annual Meeting, and that the sum of £5 be offered to the preacher towards defraying his travelling expenses."

At a meeting of the Executive Committee, February 19th, 1858, it was "Resolved, That in future all applications for aid from this Society be proposed at one meeting of the Society and considered at the next."

At a general meeting of the Society, Nov. 11, 1859, it was

Resolved, That the Executive Committee be authorized to grant, at their discretion, a sum of money, not exceeding £40, towards an outfit for any newly ordained clergyman of the Church, who may require such assistance, previous to his assumption of actual duty in the Province."

At a meeting of the Executive Committee, June 21, 1862, a grant of \$100 was made to the Rev. H. Genever, toward an outfit, upon his commencing his duty in this Province.
