The first sheet of the United States portion has just been published by the Geological Survey, in Washington. It is known in the gen-eral scheme as "sheet North K 19." but will be more popularly known as the "Boston sheet," and embraces Rhode Island and portions of New York, Connecticut, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Maine and Nova Sco-tia. 


