Main Street Paving. Tender for the Main street paving of concrete base and granite blocks were submitted and Commissioner Fisher recommended the acceptance of that of Corey & Stevens at \$2,380.

The next lowest was that of B. Mooney & Sons at \$2,472. He said that Corey & Stevens had no experience in laying granite blocks, but had promised to engage an expert paver. The motion carried.

Commissioner McLellan then asked for information about the Clarendon street work. "Did not the commissioner of public works say that his department could not undertake this work this fall?"

Commissioner Fisher—"Not in its entirety immediately."

Commissioner McLellan—"I did not understand it that way, and I am informed that the department could have made a start three weeks ago."

Commissioner Fisher—"I don't know where you got it."

Commissioner McLellan—"I did not get it from you, but I can corroborate it. A morning paper credits Commissioner Fisher with the statement that not a tap of work will be done until another motion is put through council."
