PARIS THE GAY NOW SILENT AS THE TOMB

New York, Feb. 24.—"Paris is silent as a tomb" is the description of the former gay capital given by Italy's well known historian and publicist, Guglielmo Ferrero, says a dispatch to the Staatszeitung from Milan via Berlin. The historian, inspired by bitter dislike of Germany, advocates in lectures and pamphlets that Italy take immediate action in behalf of the Allies. At present he is engaged in publishing his Paris impressions. His

picture of the silent capital of France follows:

"Paris is silent as a tomb since war was declared. Silent are the big streets, few are the people and the vehicles that pass through them. Silent also are the smaller streets, where the lone pedestrian hears the echo of his own steps on the resounding pavement. To his right and left he beholds the shuttered windows of stores and residences, as though no one lived there.

"Silent, lonely and dark are the nights. At nine o'clock the last belated pedestrians hurry through the darkness, relieved only here and there by lanterns. The city of pleasure and luxury has donned a dress of severe simplicity. The doors of the theatres are closed; the stores of the jewellers are closed; there are no more private motor cars or carriages, and all ladies walk.

"In grand palaces, where dignified liveried servants once ushered you in, an old plain-dressed servant now insects you and leads you unceremoniously upstairs over the bare steps of the foyer, whose costly thick carpets have been rolled up and whose paintings have been covered. "No more banquets are given. In the richest houses the guest is invited to partake of the frugal family table. The cafes are empty; the churches are crowded. In the subway you see women and men who never before used this conveyance. They sit there quietly, immovable, forlorn, as if they were at church.

"In the restaurant it is as quiet as in a cemetery. The guests speak in subdued voices. Nobody shouts, and everybody talks. "Strangers address each other, rich and poor, ignorant people and servants, men and women, and the conversation always drifts toward the miseries of France."

MAY ESTABLISH A DIAMOND FACTORY

Belgian Diamond Cutters Investigate Situation in Canada—Prospects Look Good

Montreal, Feb. 24.—A project is on foot to establish a diamond manufacturing in this city, where it is believed by the promoters that successful competition can be carried on with the whole world. There arrived from Holland Messrs. M. Diamant and Jos. Gutworth, diamond manufacturers, and after taking apart the situation in the Windsor, they explained their mission to this country. They had carried on a big business in Antwerp, Belgium, that a few days before the Germans entered. They had crossed over into Holland, but with German permission they returned several times, witnessing ruin and desolation on every hand.

The two Belgians had an appointment with Sir George E. Foster in Ottawa to discuss the question of the tariff in connection with diamond manufacturing in Canada.

The capital at first invested would be well on to half a million, but it would amount eventually to several millions. Their reason for coming to Canada is that they believe the war may be a long one, and even if the conflict is brought to a close soon, Belgium will be in bad shape for some time to come. The Belgians are of the opinion that economic conditions will bring the war to a close, rather than the armies in the field, as it looks as if Germany is in a bad state for food.
