GOW SELLS FOR \$1,100 Hundred Ayrshires are Disposed of for \$14,045 — "The Cow Without a Peer"

Worcester, June 18.—The record auction price for an ayrshire cow was brought at a combination sale of cattle of that breed under the auspices of the New England ayrshire club, when the Lotus Fields of West Berlin, Va., paid \$1100 for a cow whose record as a prize winner has brought her the title, "The cow without a peer."

The cow won first prizes in Scotland and is by the same sire as the London dairy show winners of 1907, 1907 and 1908. The sire won three firsts as a yearling and her granddam won first five times in 1890.

The cow was from the consignment of Robert Hunter & Sons, Maxville, Ontario, Canada. Other fancy prices paid were \$675 for a cow imported from Scotland and \$500 for another animal, all from the Maxville, Ontario, farm. The sale was conducted at the New England fair grounds under cover and was considered one of the most successful sales of the breed ever held. In all, 100 cows were sold and the total price paid was \$14,045.
