Two egg yolks, well beaten, 1 scant cuj of sugar and heaping teaspoon cornstared Beat well together, add 1 teaspoon lemo extract and 1 cup of thick sour milk. Bea all thoroughly with an egg beater, and pake in one crust like custard. Frost with whites of eggs beaten stiff, and sweetened.


