

THAW AND WIFE IN COURT ROOM

Alienist Insists Harry is Sane—Evelyn to go on Stand?

Philadelphia, April 15.—Harry K. Thaw is suffering from asphyxia, but this is not serious enough to prevent him being declared sane and liberated from the West Philadelphia Asylum, according to Dr. Charles K. Mills, eminent alienist and witness in Thaw's sanity trial before a jury. Dr. Mills was put through a long cross-examination by counsel for the trustees of Thaw's estate, and he maintained that Thaw is sane and would not be a menace if set free.

J. V. CUNNINGHAM GETS APPOINTMENT

Is Named City Electrician to Succeed Barry Wilson.

The City Council yesterday afternoon appointed J. Vernon Cunningham as city electrician at a salary of \$2,000 per year. Mr. Cunningham has been acting city electrician since the appointment of Barry Wilson as engineer of the Civic Power Commission.

The Common Clerk reported that F. L. Potts and G. F. Fisher would be the candidates in the final election for Mayor and J. H. Frink, R. G. McInerney, W. L. Harding and Alex. Corbett, the candidates for commissioner.

Authorization for the expenditure by the Civic Power Commission of \$15,000 for the materials and poles was granted.

Mayor Fisher reported that he had accepted service of a writ in the suit of Frank C. Garson against the city. The claim of Mr. Garson is for the return of \$100.00 which he says he paid in a mistake to the city chamberlain on the wrong property.

A petition from several residents of the West Side, asking for a sidewalk on the northeast side of City Line was referred to the Commissioner of Public Works.

N. B. LUMBERMEN ORGANIZE FOR "SAFETY FIRST"

The newly organized "New Brunswick Lumbermen's Safety Association" has made public the following:

"The assessments against the lumbering industry in this province for workmen's compensation have reached such large proportions that the annual assessments have become a very heavy charge on the industry."

"These assessments are based on the number of accidents and the consequent amount of money paid out for claims and medical fees."

"To reduce these the entire lumbering industry of the province has become organized as the 'New Brunswick Lumbermen's Safety Association,' with F. C. Beatty, vice-president and general manager of the Stetson, Cutler company as president and W. E. Anderson, the well-known insurance agent and broker, as secretary."

"Mr. Anderson's extensive experience in handling workmen's compensation insurance when that business was being carried in this province by the insurance companies put him in possession of just the knowledge required to assist mill owners and operators in reducing accidents and claim costs."

"The lumbering industry as a group realize that if it is to remain in business something must be done to cut down the present very large financial outlay they are obliged to make for workmen's compensation, and the purpose of the Safety Association will be to work in close co-operation with the Workmen's Compensation Board and the factory inspector in a determined effort to reduce the number of accidents to employees in the lumbering industry."

FEW LIBERALS MAY BOLT ON TARIFF

The announcements of policy made by the acting Finance Minister are understood to have been received enthusiastically by the great mass of the members, but it is reported that there may be a few "bolters." BANK DIRECTORS MUST BE TRIED

Toronto, April 15.—The 10 directors and officials of the Home Bank of Canada, now under indictment on two counts, that of conspiracy to defraud and of making false returns to the Dominion Government in contravention of the Bank Act, must plead and stand trial on the former count, Mr. Justice Riddell decided today. The motion by the Crown to fix the date of trial was not disposed of on the ground that His Lordship would be engaged elsewhere in the next 10 days but in response to the protest of D. L. McCarthy, special prosecutor, that he was ready to proceed at once, bail was renewed only till April 28.

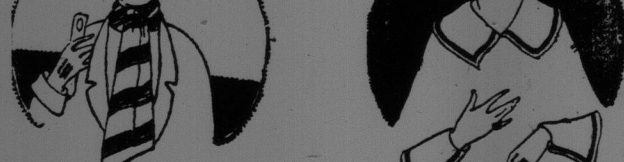
