- Q. 60. Do you not recollect anything of that incident on the night of 20-21 May?  
A. 60. No.
- Q. 61. How much money did you draw on pay parade 15 May?  
A. 61. I drew in the neighbourhood of three pounds.
- Q. 62. How much money did you have on the night of the 20th  
A. 62. I had almost two pounds. I had borrowed one pound from a fellow.
- Q. 63. How much did you have the next day?  
A. 63. In the neighbourhoods of three to five shillings.
- Q. 64. Do you remember the earlier part of the evening in the pub?  
A. 64. Yes, because the majority of our Sqn was there.
- Q. 65. Did you buy any other fellow a drink?  
A. 65. I tossed with one fellow three times and won and lost one toss later.
- Q. 66. Have you any idea of the time you left the dance?  
A. 66. I do not know, I couldn't even find out from any of the other fellows. I couldn't have stayed there any later than twelve because the dance closed then.
- Q. 67. During the time from between 11-12 until 7 the next morning you have no recollection of events?  
A. 67. No, I have not.

R.P. 83 (B) complied with.

The witness resumes his seat as the accused.

The Court, at 3.10 o'clock, adjourned until 3.30 o'clock, 15 June 1942.

On 15 June, 1942, at 3.30 o'clock, the Court re-assembled pursuant to adjournment, present the same members as when adjourned.

Prosecutor's Address:

The Prosecutor addressed the Court, reviewing the evidence on all three charges. He pointed out that the accused was placed in a position of trust in Sqn Gunnery Stores and had abused that trust by taking certain weapons in his charge and using them to force a vehicle picquet to give him a truck.

The Tommy gun was loaded and cocked, the two soldiers on the vehicle picquet might have been seriously injured. The evidence of the police was that the accused was quite normal and knew what he was doing.

He directed attention to the evidence that the accused had been able to give very precise instructions on how to unload and cock the Tommy gun.

The Prosecutor also referred to and read K.R. (Can.) 555 on drunkenness.
