"The cold wave which set its day afternoon spent its force sunday afternoon spent its force morning and warmer weather is predicted for some days to come. While it lasted it caused universal anxiety there being so direct a connection between the harvest and the personal fortunes of every resident of the province. In the city there was no frost. On Friday night the minimum reading hy Mr. Bliss, the Dominion observer, was 422 though St, John's Observatory situated in a more exposed portion of the city recorded 3S. Saturday was clear and cool and there was much apprehension as to what the night would bring. Again, however, the thermometer failed to indicate that there was any real danger, 41.5 being the lowest reading. Throughout the country the temperature went lower than in the city and in several points dropped below the frost line. At no point was there more than a light frost, two degrees being the most recorded, and but little damage appears to have been done.

Other advices from the Northwest are in effect as follows: At Neepawa the crops are looking splendid and the harvest commenced on Monday. At Birtle the wheat harvest is general; several hundred acres have been cut and the yield is 25 to 30 bushels per acre. At Gretnathe cutting of wheat is about one-third finished.

At Deloraine the harvest began on the 13th. The crops could not possibly be better. The supply of binding twine is short. At Virden the harvesting is progressing. 
