Miller, John, a U. E. Loyalist, came to St. John in 1783, and subsequently settled on Clumberland Bay, on the farm now owned and occupied by his grandson, Conrad. There was a large number of persons bearing this name who took the part of the British during the American Rebellion, many of whom held the highest offices of trust and honor. John Miller's wife's maiden name was Allen. His children were: Andrew, who married Elizabeth Sowers; John, Elizabeth Allen; Conrad, Rachel Barton; Ann, Isaac Sumaree; Sarah, Nathaniel Bartons.

The latter occupies the Marshall homestead, on the grant originally made to David Simpson, and is among the most prosperous farmers in Queen's, Mr. Marshall has in his possession the original grant of lots 36, 37, 38, 39 and 40, a quaint old document, with a seal the size of a sea-biscutt, issued June 7th, 1786, by command of Thomas Carleton, New Brunswick's first Governor. The grantees are: Alexander Boyne, lot 36, now owned and occupied by Carleton Balmaine; Francis Blackburne, lot 37, now owned and occupied by Barzilla Balmaine; David Sim Marshall; William Balmaine; David Sim Marshall; William Balmaine, lot 39, now owned and occupied by his grand-sons, David and Henry Balmaine; Francis Blackburne, lot 40, owned by the Messrs. Balmaine.

The Loyalists buried in Marshall Cemetery are: David Brill, Margaret Balmaine, Samuel Denton, John Marshall, David Sim and Stephen Thorn.

The following entry is made in David Sim Marshall's Bible, and signed by "John Marshall, St. Ann's Point, (Fredericton) Oct. 16th, 1785":—

"In memory of the 16th of October, 1785, which was so dark at half-past two till four o'clock."
