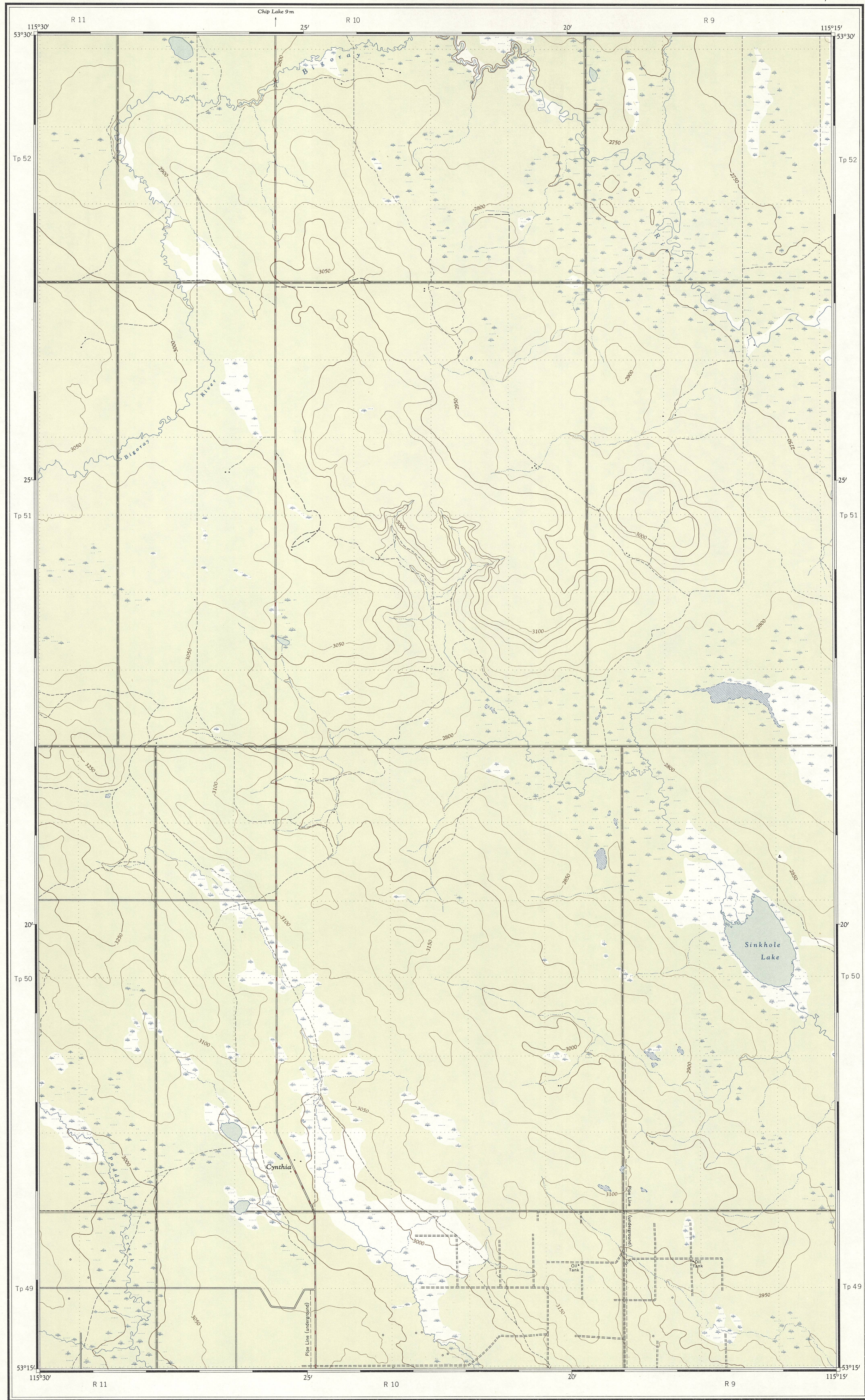

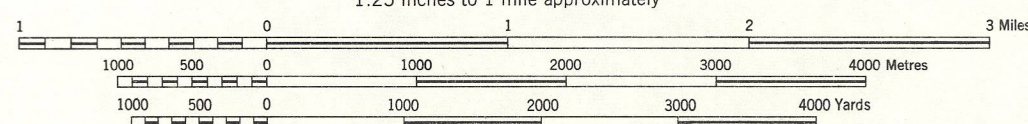
MAGNETIC DECLINATION 24°16' EAST
