RUSSIA HAS ARMY WITHOUT ANY OFFICERS

(Copyright, 1920, by Cross-Atlantic.)
Berlin, Sept. 21.—How the Russian
army is organized is described in an
interesting despatch from the war cor-
respondent of the Freiheit.

It appears there are no commissioned
officers. A small or large platoon
has a commander who is appointed if
he shows ability, and degraded if he
proves incompetent. His pay is 7,000
roubles monthly, but a loaf of bread
costs 700 roubles in Petrograd. Each
unit has in addition to the Commander
a political Commissary, who decides
jointly with the Commander how prin-
ciples and military measures are to
be carried out.

Owens a Library.
The Commissary also instructs the
troops and explains political ques-
tions. Each unit owns a library, has
a social evening once a week, and
political meetings and sports meet-
ings. The number of literate sol-
diers is said to have decreased from
80 to 40 per cent.

The correspondent adds that this
statement must be accepted with a
grain of salt. The spirit of the army
is good and it cannot be denied that
enthusiasm for its aims prevails. But
the ignorance about general politics
in Europe is astounding. Everyone
sees when the great world revolution
in the Western countries will begin.
The lower political executive centres all
its hopes on a "world revolution."
