In looking over the documents that had accumulated in this office during the interval which had lapsed between Mr. Coxes resigning the agency, and my appointment, I came across a circular letter dated July 8th 1910 Ref 59-335-2 which deals with the unrest among the Indians of B.C. and the part taken by certain whites in organizing a systematic campaign for the settlement of the land question.

This Summer James Sait who resides at Spencer Bridge B.C. arrived at Telegraph Creek on same Boat with Inspector Tyson and at once set to work to hold clandestine meetings with the Indians, as he had done the previous year. I am told by the Indians that he informed them that he was working for the Government and he collected the sum of Eleven Hundred Dollars from them and assured them that
